Improving Vital Habitat for the Blanding's turtle! By Tyler Bruck, Land Stewardship Director

An exciting project Whiterock Conservancy has been collaborating on with the Iowa DNR, is vegetation management that will provide crucial habitat for the Blanding's turtle, which is classified as a threatened species in Iowa. The decline of the Blanding's turtle is largely due to the loss of marshland habitat, but fortunately, Whiterock Conservancy continues to manage and preserve these essential natural areas that the Blanding's turtle calls home.

The project began when a nesting area was identified adjacent to a wetland area protected by Whiterock. However, the Blanding's turtles face difficulty getting to their nesting grounds due to a barrier of notorious reed canary grass, which invades wetland plant species and creates a thick mat of vegetation that makes it difficult for the hatched turtles to travel back to the safety of the wetland. Whiterock's goal is to remove the reed canary grass and establish a diverse native vegetation.


Management started this fall by hand harvesting seed for the site and conducting prescribed fire to create a good seed bed for frost seeding in the upcoming months. Restoration efforts will continue for several years until the native plant species have been established. Throughout this process, we have been able to invite volunteers to learn and participate in this project through seed harvesting and prescribed burning. Thank you to those who volunteered to help Whiterock with this significant project that will improve our natural areas and benefit the wildlife that depend on these crucial spaces in Iowa.

During the process of implementing the management plan for this important habitat area, Tyler Bruck, Land Stewardship Director, crossed paths with a female Blanding's turtle! This was a special moment and a good reminder that what we do does make an impact.
